September 18, 2022

1. Pope Francis chose to name himself after Saint Francis of Assisi because he wants the Church to serve the poor and care for God's Creation as Francis of Assisi did.
2. Pope Francis leads a simple lifestyle.
3. When you serve two masters like God and wealth, you will be devoted to one and despise the other.
4. The manager carried out the Catholic social teaching of a preferential option for the poor.
5. During the Liturgy of the Word, we hear God's Word from the Bible and reflect on what it means for our lives.

September 25, 2022

1. Lazarus is in Heaven with Abraham, but the Rich Man is in Hell.
2. The Gospel reading prompts us to share our wealth, but also to notice people who are in need around us.
3. Amos said, "Woe to the complacent," which means someone who is self-satisfied, smug, secure, unaware of danger.
4. Catholic social teaching has seven principles based on the belief that all humans are invaluable and worthy of respect as members of the human family created by God.
5. The Smiling Pope is Blessed Pope John Paul I.

October 2, 2022

1. Jesus teaches us that when we possess even a little faith we can do great things.
2. Faith is a gift from God that enables us to believe in him and all he has revealed.
3. Jesus promises us that faith gives us power to act as he acts, such as forgiving, including others, welcoming others, and loving others.
4. We state our faith each time we pray the Nicene Creed.
5. Paul urges Timothy to use his gift of leadership given to him by the Holy Spirit and to take on his share of the hardship for the Gospel.

October 9, 2022

1. The kinds of prayers are blessing, petition and intercession, adoration, thanksgiving, and praise.
2. The five steps of *Lectio Divina* are: Read the Bible, meditate on the text, pray, contemplate, and act on the text.
3. The three related meanings of the word *Church* are: all the people of God throughout the world, a diocese or local church community, and the assembly of the faithful gathered to celebrate the Eucharist.
4. Jesus calls us to recognize that God loves all people and to appreciate everyone who shows us love.
5. Bishops receive the fullness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

October 16, 2022

1. Former slave Harriet Tubman risked her life by returning to the South 19 times to rescue other slaves.
2. Unlike the crooked judge, God will answer our prayers out of love.
3. Prayer is lifting up one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from him.
4. God tells Moses that his name is "I Am Who Am."
5. People who act aggressively state their feelings in a direct, often hurtful, way; people who act assertively state their feelings, but with respect for others; and people who act passively don't say or act on what they feel.

October 23, 2022

1. Parables are short stories that use every day situations to teach a moral lesson. Jesus used parables to teach his followers.
2. We are called to view and respect others as "another self," meaning a person with the same value as us before God.
3. The Pharisees were a pious religious group. They studied the Law of Moses and the written law of the Bible.
4. The parable from the Gospel changes our idea of who is ideal in God's eyes by showing that the Pharisee's, and thus our own, image of greatness may not be what is great in God's eyes.
5. Our mission from Jesus is to make disciples of all nations. We call this evangelization, meaning we must share the Good News of Jesus Christ with others.

October 30, 2022

1. Jesus' visit with Zacchaeus shows his purpose to save the ones who needed his love and forgiveness most.
2. When someone experiences a conversion, it changes one's whole life, turning away from sin and toward God.
3. The purpose of the Book of Wisdom is to strengthen, uplift, and guide the community when it was experiencing suffering and oppression. It is a call to seek God's wisdom.
4. The four stages of the Sacrament of Reconciliation are: invitation, confession, satisfaction, and forgiveness.
5. The Communion of Saints are all Christians, living and dead.

November 6, 2022

1. Jesus' Resurrection from the dead made this belief the very heart of Christian faith.
2. Heaven is a life of eternal happiness with God and all those who love him.
3. The Sadducees of Jesus' time were priests and elders who believed only in the written Law of Moses. They considered resurrection of the dead a new idea, one that Moses never taught.
4. When Moses lived, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob were long dead, but God speaks of them as though they are present. For God, all are alive, Jesus tells us.
5. The United Nations wants world hunger to end by the year 2030.
