September 22, 2024

1. Steven played the guitar.
2. Jesus told his disciples that the Son of Man would be handed over to people who would kill him. Three days later he will rise.
3. They were arguing about who among them was the greatest. Jesus told them whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.
4. An assembly is when God's people gather to praise and thank God and to be a sign of Christ's presence in the world.
5. An audience simply looks and listens. An assembly acts by standing, sitting, singing, and speaking as well as bowing, kneeling, listening, touching, giving, receiving, eating, drinking, and embracing.

September 29, 2024

1. Pope Francis was elected Pope on March 13, 2013.
2. Pope Francis chose the name of Saint Francis of Assisi because the saint cared for the poor and the environment as we should.
3. Jesus asks us to respond to God's call to follow as he did—wholeheartedly, no matter what the obstacles or the cost.
4. The book is called the lectionary.
5. The First Reading sets the theme for Sunday. The same theme will come up in the Gospel reading.

October 6, 2024

1. We call our family our first Church.
2. About half of all children in the United States will experience divorce.
3. Jesus was angry with his disciples when they tried to stop the children from seeing him. Jesus said whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it.
4. Married people receive the power of Jesus' love to help them love one another.
5. The sacraments are instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church.

October 13, 2024

1. Hannah's Lunchbox is a YouTube video about the Salwen family who has given about half of what they have to help people. Hannah Salwen started it when she was 14.
2. The rich man went away sad because Jesus said the man would have to give all his money to the poor and follow him.
3. Jesus wants us to follow him; to listen and learn together and to treat one another with respect.
4. Discipleship is following Jesus and helping to spread his message of loving one another.
5. A turning point in the life of Saint Oscar Romero was the murder of his friend, Father Rutilio Grande.

October 20, 2024

1. Accept any of the countries listed on page 3 of the October 20 Visions lesson.
2. Jesus asked James and John that question because he knew that he would be put to death.
3. Jesus came to serve others and to give his life to save many.
4. The common good is any social condition that allows people in groups or individuals to reach their fulfillment, or their potential, as a human being. It means respecting one another because every person is created in the image and likeness of God.
5. Catholic social teaching teaches us that every person has the duty to protect basic human rights.

October 27, 2024

1. The 21st Ecumenical Council, known as Vatican II, took place from October 11, 1962, to December 8, 1965.
2. Students can choose any of the five bulleted items on page 3: turned the altar, vernacular language, restored Prayers of the Faithful, restored the Sign of Peace, created the three-year cycle of readings.
3. Jesus says that Bartimaeus' faith has saved him.
4. Faith is a gift and free response to what God reveals.
5. We still have the conversation at Church on Sundays in the Word and sacrament of Mass.

November 3, 2024

1. Vinny Halloran followed Jesus' Great Commandment by giving up his life to save others on September 11, 2001.
2. Jesus told the Teacher that he is not far from the Kingdom of God because he understood what Jesus was teaching about the Great Commandment.
3. The first part of the Great Commandment is to love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. The second part commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves.
4. Commandments are laws from God. The Ten Commandments were the divine laws revealed to the People of Israel that describe our relationship and duties to God, others, and ourselves.
5. The Sh'ma is a Jewish prayer that tells us Israel's most basic belief: the Lord our God is Lord alone. Another way to say this is the Lord our God is one.

November 10, 2024

1. The farmworkers work very long hours and do not know whether they will have work each day. They must pay high rates for housing.
2. Jesus said the widow gave more than all the others because she gave what she had to live on and the others gave what they could spare without hurting.
3. Charity is the virtue of love-inspired goodwill, kindness, and generosity toward others.
4. After Communion, those who wished to would contribute. The collection was used by the president, or priest, to take care of orphans and widows and other needy people.
5. Our choices and actions show what we value and who we think is important.
