March 12, 2023

1. Dorothy Day spent her whole life fighting injustice and war and offering love and hospitality to everyone.
2. The Townspeople said they know that Jesus is the savior of the world.
3. Samaritans live in central Israel, and, in Jesus' time, other Jewish people regarded Samaritans as heretics because they didn't worship at the Temple in Jerusalem.
4. Salvation does not come from a physical place, instead it will be where people worship in spirit and in truth.
5. Jesus taught us to love our enemies and pray for those who hurt us.

March 19, 2023

1. As the story continues, the blind man can now see, but he also grows to appreciate more fully who Jesus is.
2. We can help our faith grow through prayer, studying Scripture, and attending Mass.
3. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick brings Jesus' healing, strengthening power to those who are sick and suffering.
4. The more we hear about Jesus, the more we will see and become like him and grow in faith that he is God with us.
5. God did not choose Jesse's older son, he chose the youngest and least expected: David.

March 26, 2023

1. Jesus asks Martha if she believes that those who believe in him will never die.
2. Before Jesus commands Lazarus to come out of the tomb, he prays to the Father and thanks him for hearing his prayer.
3. God commands Ezekiel to walk through a field scattered with human bones.
4. The Resurrection is Jesus' passage from death to new life three days after his Crucifixion.
5. Eucharistic miracles are ways that God acts to strengthen our belief in the presence of Jesus' Body and Blood in the Eucharist.

April 2, 2023

1. Judas Iscariot was the Apostle who handed Jesus over to the authorities.
2. Jesus broke the bread and said: "This is my body." Then he took the cup of wine and said: "This is my blood."
3. Jesus prayed that he wouldn't have to suffer, but he also prayed to do the Father's will.
4. Jesus says all this has happened in order to fulfill what the prophets wrote.
5. Jesus died on the Cross so our sins are forgiven.

April 9 & 16, 2023

1. Easter is the day the Church celebrates Jesus' Resurrection, the high point of the Liturgical Year.
2. The first person to see that Jesus was not in the tomb was Mary Magdalene.
3. Jesus tells Mary Magdalene to go to his friends and tell them that he is ascending to the Father, "to my God and to your God."
4. We are Easter People because we are connected to those who experienced the first Easter. We celebrate Jesus' Death and Resurrection, which free us from sin and open us to new life.
5. Every Christian who lives and loves like Jesus is a witness to his new life and becomes like a missionary to one another.

April 23, 2023

1. The disciples' hearts were burning as Jesus walked with them and explained the Scriptures.
2. The disciples at Emmaus recognized Jesus when he broke the bread.
3. Jesus is present during Mass in the Eucharist, in the person of the priest celebrating Mass, in the Word, and in the people assembled in Jesus' name.
4. The Mass is the Church's central act of public worship. Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross and his Resurrection are made present to us in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.
5. We read the letters of Saint Paul in the Second Reading at almost every Mass.

April 30, 2023

1. We refer to Jesus as the Good Shepherd because he is our constant guide and selfless protector.
2. A martyr is a person who dies for his or her faith.
3. Jesus is the gate of the Church because people come into the Church because they believe in Jesus.
4. We are only baptized once because in Baptism our soul is imprinted with a permanent mark, so we only need the Sacrament once.
5. Saint Isidore was an eleventh-century farmer, who with his wife Maria, is known for his reverence for God and his care for animals and people who were poor. Saint Kateri was the first Native American to be recognized as a saint. She is the patron for ecology, exiled people, and Native Americans.

May 7, 2023

1. We should not let our hearts be troubled because we have faith in God and Jesus, and Jesus said he is preparing a place for each of us.
2. Jesus says that he is the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Jesus.
3. We are like living stones in the new temple built of people rather than stones. Jesus is the cornerstone of this new living temple.
4. Ministry is how we can serve others in the Church and in the world.
5. The three ministries established by the Sacrament of Holy Orders are: deacon, priest, and bishop.
